

MUTUAL INFORMED CONSENT

Doctor

As you asked me to do and to meet legal obligations, it is a pleasure that:

- 1) I confirm that you have explained to me in detail the minor and major risks inherent in any intervention and those specific to the operation of I ask you to please practice on me.
- 2) I also acknowledge that I have been able to ask you all the questions concerning this intervention and that I have taken note that it involves not only all the risks and dangers of any surgical intervention, but also those inherent in the said intervention, in particular the unpredictability of the duration, aspects and different forms of healing, as well as the exceptional risks.
- 3) I confirm that the possible complications specific to general anesthesia have been explained to me and that they will be discussed during the consultation with the anesthesiologist.
- 4) I also acknowledge having informed you, sincerely and fully, of the interventions, care, treatments and medications that I have benefited from and that I am currently undergoing, as well as the complications that have arisen.
- 5) I confirm that the explanations you have provided me have been in terms clear enough for me to ask you to perform this surgery.
- 6) I acknowledge that, by mutual agreement, we have agreed that a minimum period of 7 days between the submission of the estimate and the possible intervention must be respected.
- 7) I acknowledge that the decision for surgery is taken by mutual agreement between:

* A patient who expresses a desire, obtains information and consults with the aim of having

* The surgeon who explains to him the technical possibilities specific to his particular case, the methods and the vagaries of a surgical intervention.

This mutual agreement requires, once the decision has been made, regular medical follow-up which allows the surgeon to provide his patient with all the technical means at his disposal. Post-operative contingencies, if they arise, can thus be dealt with as well as possible, and, just as the operative decision is common, so is any responsibility inherent in its development and its consequences.

I am convinced that you will use all the means at your disposal to achieve the desired result.
